

## **YOUR VOTE IS UNDER ATTACK!**

## JOIN SMART ELECTIONS IN ALBANY ON JUNE 6<sup>TH</sup> TO DEMAND THAT THE NEW YORK STATE ELECTION COMMISSIONERS:

- Support hand-marked paper ballots and secure, well-maintained ballot-marking devices (BMDs) for voters with disabilities.
- Reject risky "hybrid" voting machines the Dominion Image Cast Evolution (ICE) and the ES&S ExpressVote XL:
  - Security experts say can be hacked to add fake votes to paper ballots.
  - They score poorly with voters with disabilities.
- Reject touch screen voting machines:
  - Touch screen voting systems have many security risks. New York State has never approved them, but they are in the process of being certified now.
- Reject counting votes with barcodes:
  - The ES&S ExpressVote XL counts votes with a barcode.
  - Barcodes add new vectors for hacking elections and are not transparent.
  - The barcode-based setup "makes a mockery of the notion that the ballot is 'voter-verifiable,'" said Duncan Buell, a computer science professor at the University of South Carolina, because "what the voter verifies is not what is tallied." Politico Magazine

Security experts recommend hand-marked paper ballots for most voters, and ballot-marking devices (BMD's) for voters with disabilities. Some "hybrid" voting machines merge a scanner and a BMD printer into the same path. These hybrids can add fake votes onto the ballot after it is cast. The NY State Board of Elections has approved one such machine, the Dominion ICE, and it is now in use in three NY counties. The ES&S ExpressVote XL, another risky hybrid, is undergoing NY state certification currently. Vendors claim these systems help people with disabilities, but voters with disabilities are not satisfied with them.
